

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Board of Fire Commissioners of the Yorktown Heights Fire District in the Town of Yorktown, County of Westchester, State of New York, at a meeting held on the 14th of July, 2026, duly adopted the following Resolution, subject to a permissive referendum.

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE BOARD OF FIRE COMMISSIONERS OF THE YORKTOWN HEIGHTS FIRE DISTRICT, TOWN OF YORKTOWN, COUNTY OF WESTCHESTER, STATE OF NEW YORK, TO SELL OR OTHERWISE DISPOSE OF PERSONAL PROPERTY OF THE FIRE DISTRICT CONSISTING OF A 2002 KME FIRE APPARATUS, WHICH VEHICLE IS NO LONGER NECESSARY FOR ANY OF THE USES OR PURPOSES OF THE DISTRICT AT SUCH TIME, AND UPON SUCH TERMS AND CONDITIONS AS THE BOARD IN ITS DISCRETION MAY DETERMINE:

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of Fire Commissioners of the Yorktown Heights Fire District in the Town of Yorktown, County of Westchester, State of New York, as follows:

WHEREAS, pursuant to Town Law §176(23), the Board of Fire Commissioners of the Yorktown Heights Fire District, Town of Yorktown, County of Westchester, State of New York (“the Board”), does hereby declare that the 2002 KME fire apparatus, bearing vehicle identification number IK9AF428X2N058532 and known within the Fire District as “Engine 270,” is no longer necessary or useful for the purposes of the Fire District; and

WHEREAS, the Board has determined that said 2002 KME fire apparatus has retained some market value, which value is estimated to be greater than \$20,000.00 but less than \$100,000.00;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Board finds that said 2002 KME fire apparatus (“Engine 270”) is deemed surplus, and this asset should be disposed of by the Board in a manner designed to secure the best price obtainable in their judgment, or the most beneficial terms in the public interest; and

IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED THAT, whereas this asset may be sold through a public notice and auction process, use of any other public notice procedure, placement of ads in publications and general circulation or electronic classified ads or auction sites, or by negotiation, the Board has determined the best method of disposal so as to achieve the greatest value and to ensure that the sale price is upon the best or most beneficial terms is through public advertisement for bids through an appropriate vendor.

This resolution is adopted subject to a permissive referendum.
